


Intolerable Acts



They were fighting over land. The French & Indians wanted it for beaver. The British wanted it for farming.

The British won, but it cost them a lot of money to win the war. Soldiers & supplies cost money. They borrowed money to pay for the war.

The King of England made a law that colonists can't go west of the Appalachian mountains. He wanted to keep the colonists safe from the Native Americans and didn't have money to pay for more soldiers to protect them. The colonists were not happy.






Quartering Act

Stamp Act

After the war, the British kept soldiers in the colonies to protect and keep an eye on them. King George said the colonists must quarter (house), the British soldiers. The colonists didn't like it.

Stamp Act: To pay for the war and the soldiers, Britain required the colonist to pay taxes when they bought items such as newspapers, calendars and playing cards. They marked the items with a stamp to show they had paid the tax.

They also taxed sugar & molasses in the Sugar Act.





No taxation without representation!


Sons of Liberty

Groups formed to protest


against the British. They didn't have a say in the laws because they didn't have any delegates in Parliament.

Repeal of Stamp Act- 1766

The colonists boycotted English goods.
British Parliament repealed (cancelled) the Stamp Act.




Boston Massacre- 1770
Colonists were throwing rocks and snowballs at the British soldiers. A soldier thought he heard someone say, "Fire!" so they shot into the angry 5 people died. Some colonists exaggerated the story in hopes of making more people dislike the British.



Boston Tea Party- 1773

To protest the Tea Act, colonists dressed as Native Americans and boarded a British ship. They threw all the crates of tea in the Harbor. This made the British very angry.







Intolerable Acts- 1774

Committees of Correspondence

To punish them for dumping the tea, Britain would not let any ships in or out of the Boston harbor until they paid for the tea. They also made other unbearable laws.

Colonists wrote letters to other colonies telling them what Britain was doing. People sent food and supplies. Colonists became angry!

Event	Year	What Happened?	Reaction
Proclamation of 1763	1763	-Result of <u>French & Indian</u> War. -The <u>British</u> government set a western boundary for the colonies.	-Colonists were <u>angry</u> they had been told they could not move to the west. -Colonists felt it took away their rights. Some believed the King did not have <u>authority</u> .
Quartering Act	1765	-Colonists had to house and and soldiers	-Colonists felt they should not have to <u>pay</u> for British soliders and protested the Act.
Stamp Act	1765	-A <u>tax</u> was placed on <u>paper</u> goods like playing cards, licenses and newspapers. -A <u>stamp</u> was placed on the item to show the tax was paid.	-Colonists said it was an unfair tax. - "No taxation without representation " which meant they should have a say in the government. -Colonists boycotted British goods and the law was eventually repealed.
Boston Massacre	1770	-Britain sent more soldiers -British fire on colonists and five colonists are killed.	 Paul Revere makes an engraving that may not tell the whole story. Talk of war begins.
