Stamp Act

After the war, the British kept soldiers in the colonies to protect and keep an eye on them. King George said the colonists must quarter (house), the British soldiers. The colonists didn't like it.

Stamp Act: To pay for the war and the soldiers, Britain required the colonist to pay taxes when they bought items such as newspapers, calendars and playing cards. They marked the items with a stamp to show they had paid the tax.

They also taxed sugar & molasses in the Sugar Act.
